Writing

- Write a clear and detailed text on a wide range of subjects related to the student's centers of interest.
- Write an expository text or a report, transmitting information or presenting reasons for or against a certain point of view.
- Write detailed texts clearly on various subjects related to your interests, summarizing and evaluating information and arguments collected from different sources.
- Write clear and detailed descriptions of real or imagined events and experiences, articulating ideas in a cohesive and coherent text and following conventions stipulated for the genre used.
- Write letters highlighting certain events and experiences of the student.

Reading

- Read articles and reports on contemporary subjects in relation to which the authors adopt particular attitudes or points of view.
- Understand contemporary literary texts in prose.
- Read with a high degree of independence, adapting reading style and speed to different texts and purposes and selectively using appropriate reference sources.
- Quickly scroll through a long and complex text, finding relevant details.
- Quickly identify the content and relevance of new questions, articles and reports on a wide range of professional issues, deciding whether further study is worthwhile.
