Course Description:

This course examines the formulation, interpretation, and application of law to business both domestically and internationally. Covered are the major areas of legal regulation to which businesses are subject including agency, contract law, intellectual property law, financial regulation, labor and employment as well as foreign laws, relations and policies and their effect on the multinational company doing business in countries outside of the U.S. Emphasis is placed on active, experiential application of legal reasoning and analysis and on the global and comparative dimensions of legal and ethical issues. (Note: This course may be use as an alternative to BUL 3320, BUL3322, BUL3564 and PLA4938,). 47 contact hours.

- 6. both understand and analyze agency law and how it affects business organizational structures, resources and liability domestically and abroad by,
- 7. examine and analyze contract law in the traditional and online settings both domestically and abroad by
- 8. assess the laws protecting intellectual property in the traditional and online settings domestically as well as internationally by,
- 9. compare and contrast structures regulating commerce while also evaluating the meaning of international investment and its effect on the multi-national's decision-making process from a banking, finance, trade and transportation of goods and services perspective by,
