Being a by-product of the culture of its time, music will be used as a springboard for further historical, artistic, and sociological considerations.</p>

**20. Conteúdo da unidade curricular/Syllabus** (máx. 200 palavras):

This unit will take students on a whirlwind tour of Western music from the Middle Ages up to about the 20th century. Moving from a general introduction on the fundamental musical concepts and forms, we will discuss the role of music in social, cultural, and historical contexts. We will explore different aspects related to music production such as arts, ideas, performers, audience, patrons, settings. Besides, there will be some classes on organology to introduce the various typologies of musical instruments and how they changed over time.

By listening to a varied array of pieces, we will discuss new ways of thinking about music and its place in society. The representative musical samples selected for listening will be our point of departure to explore the historical context, coeval artistic productions, and the main challenges society faced along the centuries.

**22. Métodos de ensino/Teaching Methods:**

Instruction will be primarily by lecture enhanced by audio and visual materials. Participation to the class is strongly recommended. During the class there will be ample opportunity for debate and to delve into the course material. At the beginning of each lesson there will be quizzes or open questions to resume what was discussed during the previous class.

**23. Métodos de avaliação/Assessment methods:**

ATTENDING STUDENTS (i.e., those who attend 70% of the Unit, or more):

50% of the final mark is earned by answering correctly to the quizzes and questions asked at the beginning of each class. Active participation during the class is also important.

50% of the final mark is earned by submitting an essay (ca 1300 words) on a topic chosen by the student and previously agreed with the teacher. The essay must be submitted before the end of the Unit.

NON-ATTENDING STUDENTS:

An alternative bibliography will be provided. Students will answer a final test on the contents of the bibliography (50% of the total mark) and submit an essay (ca 2000 words) on a topic chosen by the student and previously agreed with the teacher (50%).
