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
## Program overview

The Study in Portugal Network (SiPN) is a specialized study abroad provider based in Lisbon, Portugal. As a 4-university consortium of Lisbon-based universities, we aim to attract U.S. students and faculty to Portugal through various study abroad experiences.

SiPN offers semester, full-year, summer, and customized study abroad opportunities. SiPN's privileged relationship with Portuguese universities and governmental and nongovernmental entities allows us to cover virtually any topic intended to be explored in Portugal. As a **full-service study abroad program provider**, SiPN creates a nurturing environment for students and faculty seeking an enriching educational journey in Portugal. Whether pursuing a more "classic type" of semester/summer abroad or a more experiential-type curricular experience combining coursework with research/ internship opportunities, language immersion, or exploring Portugal's unique culture, SiPN offers a gateway to a memorable and enriching study abroad journey in this historically outstanding European country and the main hub of the Portuguese-speaking world.







# The organization behind SiPN

SiPN's value stems from its affiliation with FLAD, a private Portuguese non-profit foundation devoted to advancing Portugal in conjunction with the United States. FLAD's focus on Science and Technology, Education, Art and Culture, and Transatlantic Relations aims to unlock Portugal's potential, strengthen Portuguese American communities, and foster collaboration across the Atlantic. Established in 2014, SiPN embodies this vision, aiming to strengthen academic ties between Portugal and the U.S. and attract more American students to study in Portugal.

FLAD is a grant-making foundation that promotes activities in various fields with one thing in common - linking Portugal and the U.S. In addition to SiPN and promoting higher dducation internationalization, it also develops various activities, such as:














## SiPN's flagship program



The overarching goal of **SiPN's Intercultural Competency Groups** is to use an intercultural, culturally competent framework to **foster social and emotional learning, raise intercultural awareness**, and **encourage authentic and intentional engagement with the Portuguese language, culture, and people.** 





# Scholarships









### **Gilman-FLAD Portugal Scholarship**



The Gilman Program, known for supporting exceptional students pursuing study or internships abroad, has an established partnership with FLAD\*. The Gilman-FLAD Scholarship is specifically aimed at empowering students interested in studying or interning in Portugal, aiming to provide valuable opportunities for young scholars, with financial, need to explore and experience Portugal.

\*FLAD is one of 7 worldwide partners of the Gilman Program

#### **Award Amount**

- Successful applications will receive a study grant of **\$5,000**.
- Applicants who are studying Portuguese while abroad can apply for The Critical Need Language Award and get a supplemental award of up to **\$3,000** for a combined total of **\$8,000**.

### SiPN/FLAD Partial Scholarships



FLAD, the organization behind SiPN, has pledged to reinvest positive revenues generated by the program to offer additional merit-based student scholarships. Scholarship awards can go up to \$ 1,500 for semester and summer students.

#### **Fullbright Grants for SiPN Alums**



#### SiPN alumni receive priority access to FLAD Fulbright grants to Portugal.

Currently, FLAD co-funds one of the Fulbright–FLAD Study/Research Grants, which offers 8-month student grants to Portugal. These grants are available to U.S. citizens with a minimum of a Bachelor's degree, pursuing a Master's degree or conducting PhD-level research So far, 10 SiPN alums have returned to Portugal on different Fulbright awards.

#### **Colleen a SiPN Alum and Fulbright Scholar**

Colleen Beatriz SiPN Program & Year: Fall 2018 University when attending SiPN: UMass Amherst Major/Area of Interest: Epidemiology Fulbright/FLAD Research Grantee - Researching workplace experiences of LGBTQ+ workers in Portugal



#### 1. Why did you choose to study abroad with SiPN?

My dad lived in Portugal until he was 25 and I always felt a strong connection to Portuguese culture, but it always felt a bit second-hand, since I had never actually lived there myself. For me, SiPN was a great way to immerse myself in the culture I so badly wanted to connect to ,while also improving my language skills, continuing my education, and learning about the world from a whole new viewpoint.

#### 2. What is your most memorable SiPN experience? Why?

It's not one particular moment, but I'll always remember how kind and welcoming people were to me in Portugal. No matter how many mistakes I made with the language or how lost I was, people were always patient with me and so willing to help. That's something I'll always be thankful for.



#### 3. What insight or lesson (if any) do you still carry with you from your experience with SiPN?

My time with SiPN helped me to learn the importance of seeing the world through different lenses. Through my coursework and simply talking to people, I was exposed to so many new viewpoints, which I still carry with me whenever I'm learning something new.

#### 4. What work are you currently undertaking on your Fulbright grant?

Currently, I'm doing mixed-methods research on the workplace experiences of LGBTQ+ individuals in Portugal. My research aims to describe workplace satisfaction, experiences of coming out at work, and experienced support and discrimination in the workplace, using both quantitative and qualitative measures.

#### 5. Did SiPN influence your decision to apply to Fulbright? If so, how?

Definitely! I fell in love with Portugal during my semester with SiPN and knew that I wanted to come back for a longer period of time, but I wasn't sure how I would do that. When I learned about FLAD's connection with Fulbright, that sounded like the perfect opportunity for me and told myself that I would apply to come back after I finished my master's degree.

#### 6. Do you hope to stay connected to Portugal once your Fulbright grant ends? If so, how?

I absolutely want to stay connected to Portugal (and come back to Lisbon!) after my Fulbright grant ends. I'm still trying to figure out exactly what that will look like, but I know that, at least in the immediate future, my experiences in Portugal will help me to connect to the Luso-American population that I'm sure to be working with when I return to Massachusetts.

#### 7. Anything else you would like to share?

Nothing too insightful, but I feel really thankful for my time with SiPN and would encourage anyone who is considering it to apply!
