In Weeks 2 and 3, students gain experience in ethnographic fieldwork from the workshop, interviews with Afro-Portuguese filmmakers, and guided

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	tours/visits to Lisbon film locations.		
	Week 3 and 4 are dedicated to data interpretation and collation. Students work on team papers, synthesizing their fieldwork findings into coherent research outputs.
